

### **2022 SECTION MEETINGS**

### February 18, 2022 – TBPELS Ethics

As always, the year kicked off with an ethics seminar on February 18th presented by the Texas Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors (TBPELS). The speaker, Rick Strong, P.E., Director of Licensing and Registration for TBPELS, delivered his presentation in a virtual setting. Mr. Strong emphasized that work performed by professional engineers has the potential to impact many people, and it is expected that professional engineers will comply with the ethical standards. This meeting was attended by 51 members.



### April 29, 2022 – The Ray

On Friday, April 29th, Laura Rogers, Deputy Director at The Ray, presented on "The Ray Highway", a pilot program which envisions to build a zero-carbon, zero-waste, zero-death highway system. At present, The Ray is a net-zero highway testbed being developed by the company and is located on 18 miles of Interstate highway in Georgia. Laura is responsible for technology transfer from The Ray to other transportation agencies across the country as well as scaling the technologies used at this project extensively. During this meeting, Laura also highlighted the public-private-philanthropic importance of partnerships. The meeting was held in a virtual format and was attended by 22 members.



#### June 17, 2022 – Cedar Park Bond Update

Our first in-person meeting of the year was held at the City of Austin Permitting and Development Center on Friday, June 17th. Stephen Hanuscin, the City of Cedar Park Assistant Director of Public Works, discussed the Cedar Park Transportation Bond which passed in the May 2022 elections. The proposition will provide funding for continued expansion and improvements to the City's roadway, bicycle, and pedestrian facilities. Stephen, who is also the CASITE Vice President/President-Elect, presented a cost breakdown of the proposed bond projects, including the \$86.6 Million allotted for transportation projects. This meeting was attended by 45 people.



### July 15, 2022 – CASITE/STITE Joint Meeting

The annual joint CASITE/STITE meeting was held on Friday, July 15th at the San Marcos Activity Center. Representatives from Austin Transit Partnership (ATP) and VIA Metropolitan Transit (VIA) joined us to discuss "Improving the Mobility and Connectivity of the Region." Lonny Stern, ATP Interim Director of Community Engagement, provided an update on Project Connect in Austin, including the proposed options for the Blue Line Bridge. Arturo Herrera, VIA Special Projects Manager, showcased the Keep San Antonio Moving projects, including the advanced rapid transit plans. Speakers elaborated on the innovative methodologies used in these projects. This meeting was attended by 62 people.



### August 26, 2022 – CAMPO Transportation Dashboard

On Friday, August 26, Tom Fowler and Caroline Leonard with Kimley-Horn discussed building a Regional Transportation Statistics and Metrics Dashboard for CAMPO. The dashboard went live a couple of days after the meeting. Tom and Caroline presented the various challenges they faced in developing the dashboard, the data sources they used, and the remaining progress updates they plan to make. They also accepted various suggestions from the audience on improvements to the dashboard. This meeting was attended by 44 members.



### October 14, 2022 – Austin Transportation Department Vision Zero

Vision Zero is the City of Austin goal to reduce the number of people injured or killed by crashes to zero through road improvements, policy changes, and education. The City of Austin Transportation Department (ATD) works to achieve that goal through planning and building a safe multi-modal transportation network in collaboration with City and community partners. Some of these efforts were highlighted by Cody Stone, P.E., PTOE and Joel Meyer, AICP from ATD in our meeting on Friday, October 14. They presented on various initiatives within the ATD Vision Zero Program and discussed the main approaches they focus on: Intersection Safety, Systemic Safety, Speed Management, and Rapid Response. They presented three intersections as case studies and the various improvement measures they implemented as part of the program. This meeting was attended by 53 people.



### December 9, 2022 – End of Year Luncheon

With over 55 members in attendance, the CASITE end-of-year luncheon at Stiles Switch BBQ was a fantastic time of fellowship, networking, recognitions, and looking forward. We wrapped up 2022 business, awarded scholarships, recognized all of our committee volunteers, and announced CASITE officer election results, while enjoying some of Austin's best BBQ. Claire McKinney was elected to serve Secretary-Treasurer, Gregory Go was elected to serve as Vice President/President-Elect, and Stephen Hanuscin was sworn in as 2023 President. Immediate Past President, Anamaria Torres, was awarded a plaque for her years of dedicated service to the Section. Congratulations to everyone!
